The Mystery of the Crossword Clues

These crossword clues were jotted in the margin of the Guardian.

(British crosswords are often called "Cryptic" crosswords in the States. If you've never solved one, ask Game Control for a guide on how they're clued.)

One of the tough things about cryptics is determining which part of the clue is the definition, and which part hints at the word play. Below, the definition part is underlined. For example, "hairdo, I hear" hints at some word that means "principal".

Unpacks, enlists, pays attention (7)

In the vicinity of a fight (5)

Widow never held <u>elevator button</u> (4)
